## AT LARGE ELECTION

The first Congressional election in Pennsylvania was conducted at large with each voter casting a vote for eight candidates. At the time, the Federalists had a narrow (10-8) margin in the state Senate, and (36-33) in the House.

Fearing that the Anti-Federalists might win a majority in a Congressional delegation elected by district, The Federalists approved an at-large election in which frontier dissention was overwhelmed by the larger number of voters in southeastern Pennsylvania. Two candidates, Muhlenberg and Heister, were claimed by the *Federal Gazette*, as being Federalists, but that the Anti-federalists had "artfully placed the names" on their ticket.
