* "The Committee of Privileges and Elections...called to Account the Sheriff of *Newcastle* County, for unduly electing a member to serve in the Assembly, for that County.

The Speaker having taken the Chair, the Chairman of Committee of Privileges and Elections, reports to the House, that *Abraham Man* and his Party, had made some illegal procedure the Day of Election at *Newcastle* that he might be elected a Member of the House; several witnesses having been heard and exmained on both Sidesthe Committee adjudged *John Moll* to be duly elected. Reasons having been given to the House for the same, it was put to the Vote, Whether *Abraham Man* or *John Moll*, was duly elected; it was carried *in the Affirmative* for *John Moll*..."
