\*\* The *Franklin Gazette*, quoted in *Niles' Register*, 20 October 1821, claimed 17 Democrats and 14 Federalists, a difference of three from the *Oracle* list. While there was no breakdown by name in the *Register*, the three individuals in question appear to have been Robert Willett (Dist. 9), William Davidson (Dist. 17), and Rees Hill (Dist. 18), all of whom voted frequently as a group with the country Federalists.
